Omaha Public Library has collected genealogy and local history materials since 1877; the result is an extensive and eclectic collection of materials useful to genealogists and historians, housed at the Genealogy & Local History Room, one of 13 Omaha Public Library branches. Materials on site:

- Over 15,000 genealogy books and periodicals
- Over 13,000 Nebraska reference items, including complete run of Omaha city directories (1866-current), partial runs for other Nebraska cities and Council Bluffs, and Omaha and suburban phone books (1920-2019)
- Obituaries on cards, 1890s-2020s, Greater Omaha area
- Thousands of reels of genealogy microfilm (census, newspapers, etc.) Including:
